More Than 2700 Bills Introduced by First Deadline

The first major deadline for the introduction of bills made for a busy week at the Mississippi capitol. A total of 2,780 bills have been introduced since the opening day of the session. HBAM reviews every bill that is introduced to analyze its possible affect on the housing industry and the membership as a whole. We track every piece of legislation introduced and engage support of opposition to any legislation directly impacting our industry. Licensing Bills Introduced: Call Your Legislators

The Business and Financial Institutions Committee will be handling the home builder licensing bill in the Senate, SB 2977. This committee has three bills that deal with licensing, introduced by Senators Hewes, Flowers and Gary Jackson. Chairman Gary Jackson invited HBAM to explain the changes needed in the licensing bill prior to their taking action on this legislation. A committee vote is expected on proposed changes which would demand general liability insurance and continuing education as a requirement for licensing.

The Judiciary B Committee is expected to take up licensing bill HB 8 in the House. The bill was double-referred in the House to both the Judiciary B and Ways and Means Committees. **Please contact your Senators and Representatives in support of these bills.**

Swimming Pool Bill Opposed by HBAM

According to bill HB77, multifamily owners would be required to obtain a permit from the Mississippi Department of Health and pay a fee to operate a swimming pool. This is an unnecessary and costly burden for apartment owners and HBAM is fighting to keep it from becoming law. The bill is currently in the House Public Health Committee.

Eminent Domain Action Taken by Senate

The Senate Judiciary A Committee is debating a bill that would set new guidelines for eminent domain in Mississippi. HBAM is supportive of the rights of individual property owners, but believes the law should be open to consideration of economic development. Our position is consistent with the Governor's office and the Mississippi Development Authority.
